A Message from the Airmyn Parish Council

I am delighted to report that since my last update, Brian Rodger and Philip Batten have been successfully co-opted on to the parish council. Brian and Philip bring with them a vast knowledge from their personal and professional backgrounds that will add real value to the council. They have already significantly contributed to the council and, alongside their other councillor colleagues, will continue to work to make Airmyn an enjoyable place to live and work.

On behalf of the council, I attended the Metsa Group public exhibition held on 5 November 2024 at the RaisE Business Centre. The public consultation was to allow residents, councillors and interested parties to view the updated scheme prior to the planning application being submitted. I discussed with Metsa representatives' wildlife and biodiversity surveys to minimise the environment; upgrades to the sustainable transport offer to support walking, cycling and public transport; further highway modelling to improve vehicle access and movements; reviews with the Environment Agency on the proposed process water route and projections for the impact on Airmyn village, particularly vehicle movement projections. Metsa confirmed that the planning application would shortly be submitted, at which point the council would be formally consulted.

The council's partnership with the Probation Service has started extremely positively. On the first day of the partnership, the operatives assisted with leaf collecting at St David's Church to ensure the grounds looked immaculate for the Remembrance Day service. Their assistance was invaluable and saved the church volunteers many hours of raking. The operatives have also commenced several tasks in the grounds of the Memorial Hall, helping to keep the site clean and tidy. The council looks forward to developing the relationship over the coming months, for the betterment of both the village and the operatives.

As we approach the festive period, national news continues to be dominated by the cost-of-living crisis. One of the most challenging aspects of being a parish councillor is agreeing a precept for the following financial year. None more so than this year when many residents are experiencing financial uncertainty, through no fault of their own. With that in mind, the December meeting of the council saw members consider the parish precept for the financial year 2025-26. All councillors are acutely aware that Airmyn residents understandably expect to know, see, or touch where their money has been spent in the parish. With that in mind, the council reluctantly agreed to defer the submission of its parish precept until the January meeting. This was to allow the councillors to receive further information, clarification and additional projections on several matters from its parish clerk. The council did agree though, reluctantly, to reduce the number of issues of the Airmyn News it will produce in 2025. The publication will be circulated to residents in March, June, September and December 2025. Parish Council minutes will not be included in the publication due to the number of pages. They can still be viewed by visiting the parish noticeboard, contacting the parish clerk for a copy or downloading them from the councils' website. The document will also be printed in black and white. This decision was made due to the costs of printing the document and the reduction in income from businesses advertising in the publication. If residents do still want a colour copy of the document, then it can be downloaded from the council's website or emailed. Please contact the parish clerk if you require further information.

The Airmyn Community Association is currently recruiting a Caretaker to ensure that the Memorial Hall facilities are maintained to a high standard and are ready for use. The position is for 12 hours per week and the ideal candidate will work with minimal supervision, ensuring the hall is safe, secure, and properly set up for a variety of events. The position will also assist the council with administering and adhering to some of its many responsibilities. Screetons Commercial, on behalf of the council, continue to proactively promote the former Airmyn Bowls Club site. As of writing this article, negotiations are ongoing with one interested party, over entering into a long-term lease for the site. I will provide further updates as or when they are available.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council has completed its street light improvements, with several lights having LED bulbs installed. The lights are brighter and more energy efficient. However, the council is aware that not all streetlights have been upgraded. The parish clerk is therefore liaising with the borough council to ensure all the streetlights are modernised.

I hope that all residents have noticed the concerted effort that the Airmyn Events Team have put in to organise, coordinate and deliver events this past year. The Airmyn Christmas Fair was a fantastic day, with the Memorial Hall packed with families from the village and surrounding areas. With over 20 stalls at the event, food and drink, live animals in the playing field and even Santa in his grotto, the event was a huge success. Talking of success, the Airmyn Christmas Quiz attracted over 50 people to the Memorial Hall to meet, socialise and participate in the quiz. **CONT...** **CONT...** Proceeds from the event, including raffle monies will again be used to fund future events. I wish to place on record my sincere thanks to all members of the Airmyn Events Team for their efforts this year. Thank you also to residents who have supported the events and contributed their time or provided raffle prizes. Please keep an eye out on our social media channels for further events.

I wish to remind residents that PCSO Chandler from Humberside Police will attend the Memorial Hall on Wednesday 22 January 2025 (3.00 pm to 4.00 pm) and Wednesday 19 February 2025 (7.00 pm to 8.00 pm). The surgery will initially be a two-month trial. I therefore encourage any residents who wish to talk to PCSO Chandler to attend the sessions, otherwise the surgery will not continue after the trial has ended.

I also wish to remind residents that Yorkshire Ambulance Service will attend the Memorial Hall to deliver free training on first aid procedures and use of defibrillators. The training will be held on 9 January 2025 between 11.30 am and 1.00 pm. Please contact the Clerk at clerk@airmynpc.org.uk if you wish to attend. Please note this event will only be held if there is enough interest.

Thank you to all the volunteers who have contributed to Airmyn being such a wonderful place to live and work this year. Whether that be litter picking, grass cutting, trimming hedges, delivering the Airmyn News or helping at community events, your contribution is very much appreciated.


